

# CVPRD DEPARTMENT BOARD REPORTS JULY 2024

#### **Guest Services**

The Recreation Center served close to 17,000 visitors this month. This is the busiest month we have had in recent tracking. This is a 37% increase from 2022. In 2022 we averaged 396 visits a day, so far in 2024 we have averaged 542 a day.

Frederick High School sponsored 31 Quarterly memberships for eligible students this summer. This was a special perk the high school gifted to some struggling students. A new IGA was finalized with the Town of Firestone this month. One of the items in the agreement was changing the way we manage the Town's employee wellness plan. We will now offer membership to each employee, under a Town membership like how we manage the Town of Frederick's employee wellness membership. This is a much more fluid process, and we can track the individual participants.

Vietnam Veterans of America will now come to pick up our lost and found every 2 weeks. In the past, we delivered unrecovered lost and found items to goodwill every two weeks.

The total visits in the month of July were 16,948 patrons and the total revenue for the month is \$68,974.73.

#### Maintenance

In an unexpected, but pleasant, turn of events, Brian Richter has returned to work with us! He rejoined at the end of July.

After constant communication with our HVAC contractor who is hired to do the unit replacements, it has been determined that the actual units will not arrive on time for Shutdown week. This means bringing in the crane and having the units swapped out will have to occur at a different time (looking like mid-September). Most of the rest of the work can still be done during shutdown which will eliminate additional downtime.

Summer Softball/Baseball has ended. Maintenance staff are doing a few small projects to help the fields while they are not being used (Mound/batter box repair, base anchor installs, spraying outfields with herbicides) Fall softball will start on the last week of August.

We have been having some issues with graffiti, primarily in the men's bathroom. A police report was made, and several pictures were provided for the report. It was reported back to us that this has been an part of a much larger issue Carbon Valley wide.

#### 115 work orders were completed in July.

# Adult Sports

#### Adult 4x4 Coed Indoor Volleyball:

The summer season has ended and fall registration starts on July 1<sup>st</sup>. The league will run from September 8- October 2<sup>nd</sup> on Sundays at the Rec Center.

## Youth Sports

Fall sports registration closes on Monday, August 5<sup>th</sup> for soccer, softball, and volleyball.

Soccer: We will be running all age groups in-house. All games will be held in the Carbon Valley Area. Colorado Ignite Soccer Club will place some U9+ teams in our league. There are a total of 399 U5-U12 boys and girls signed up to play soccer.

Softball: CVPRD teams play in the IPGSA league. Games are held at CVPRD fields and other fields throughout the front range. There is a total of 91 girls ages 8-14 signed up to play softball.

Volleyball: Mead, and new this fall Berthoud will be playing in our fall league for volleyball. Games are held at all locations. From 1<sup>st</sup> grade to 8<sup>th</sup> grade, there are 182 players signed up.

## **Youth Programming**

Carbon Valley Camp: Staff and campers are truly enjoying themselves! They are crafting, exercising, exploring and making friends. With full weeks of camp in July, we have seen 70 different kids. Each week has had 30 kids and some of their field trips include the Animal Sanctuary, Aquarium, Museum, Adams Mystery Playhouse, and Barr Lake.



Mobile Rec: Mobile Rec wraps up this month. The last one is July 30 at Clem Dufour. Staff and kids throughout the communities enjoyed the warm weather, games and each other.

Snapology: The campers built and programmed several robots, including dinosaurs, fireflies, spiders, mantises, dolphins, bees, fish, caterpillars, snakes, and gorillas! They did this completely out of LEGO bricks!! They learned about programming and how the builds impact their movement. We had 18 kiddos for the Creature Creator Program.

Kids Night at the Rec: Another successful night! Smaller registration didn't mean less fun, we had about 56 kids in attendance.

# **Gymnastics**

July marks the end of the Gymnastics competition season for the team gymnasts. Boys headed to State on July 20<sup>th</sup>, while the girls' teams competed July 26-27. All 46 team gymnasts qualified for State, but with various vacations and trips planned only 42 gymnasts attended. Out of 42 gymnasts attending State, 39 placed on individual events or in the all-around category. Gymnasts showed a lot of growth this year and are looking forward to the 2025 season.

Session 2 gymnastics is halfway through and will end August 31. Registration for Session 3 gymnastics opens August 12 and will begin September 3. Carbon Valley Camp finished their last trip to the Gymnastics Center on July 30<sup>th</sup> and will return during holiday breaks and next summer.

### **Aquatics**

July continued to be very busy in the pool area constantly seeing 75-125 people in the pool area well into the afternoon and evening.

We sent a group of lifeguards to the 39<sup>th</sup> Annual Lifeguard Games at Water World on July 7. Ryan and Avery were also heavily involved in the event planning through the subcommittee within the CPRA Aquatics Section. Carbon Valley lifeguards improved from 2023, and this was the largest attended guard games to date.

We ended the month with a Ziggi's Coffee photo shoot in the pool area promoting an Olympic drink they have.

There was a total of 235 private swimming lesson time slots offered and 165 filled.
